Agricultural development is one of the most powerful tools to end extreme poverty, boost shared prosperity, and feed the ever increasing human population.

Hunger is the most prevalent in remote regions where people typically draw their food and livelihoods from the natural environment. Roughly, 75% of people experiencing hunger live in rural areas and these are the most affected lot. Healthy, sustainable and inclusive food systems are critical to achieve the goals of sustainable development.

Over the past years, G-BIACK has seen that farmers have increasingly been requesting for more knowledge that would help them increase their food production using sustainable forms of agriculture. Farmers have also realized that the use of chemical fertilizers has contributed to soil acidification and soil crust, thereby reducing the content of organic matter, humus content, and beneficial species. This results in stunted plant growth, altered pH of the soil, increase of pests, and even leads to the release of greenhouse gases.

Poor soil has contributed to a sharp decrease of food production thereby increasing the poverty index. All these factors are the reasons why G-BIACK strives to educate the farmers on agricultural systems that help them to improve their soils. As the soil improves, food productivity rises and the nourishment provided by the healthy plants improves as well.
