Sending Girls Empowerment Programme (GEP) girls for internship to empower the communities

The GROW BIOINTENSIVE Agriculture Centre of Kenya (G-BIACK) is running a programme that targets young women who are ready to get empowered to improve their lives and the lives of others. Our survey showed that there are thousands of young women who have cleared primary schools, or even high schools who are just loitering in their communities with no direction, while others dropped out of school due to lack of school fees, or because they fell pregnant but were never married, or because one or both of their parents have died, very often from AIDS. Another factor is that when family resources are low, parents give priority to boys.

G-BIACK's mission is to seed a sense of empowerment and self-reliance in both individuals and communities that leads to improved food sovereignty, stable and self-sufficient livelihoods, and a healthier environment. GEP girls who have learned with us will take this mission with them. We have sent them out to different regions, where they will work in orphanages, schools, and institutions of higher learning, and other people in the communities. The internships began on 13th September and will run up to 13th December 2019. The girls will provide leadership and will help in the creation of Biointensive gardens. They will educate the communities on how to grow clean and sufficient food and help keep the environment clean. We are happy to report that our girls have gone out much energized with a lot of knowledge that will empower and transform the communities.
