The Participatory Ecological Land Use Management (PELUM Kenya), in conjunction with the Biodiversity and Biosafety Association of Kenya (BIBA), The National Museums of Kenya (NMK), Inter-Sectoral Forum on Agro Ecology and Agro Biodiversity (ISFAA), Africa Biodiversity Network (ABN), HIVOs, Seed Savers Network (SSN), and Heinrich Boll Foundation (HBF), organized a 3 days event known as **Indigenous Seeds and Food Culture Harvest Fair** at the National Museum of Kenya in Nairobi on 12<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> October 2022.

This year's event focused on Seeds and Food Culture. All organizations that promote agro-ecological agriculture practices in Kenya were invited for the exhibition contest where awards would be presented. Over 50 organizations exhibited.

Other activities included panel presentations and debates on matters concerning seeds by invited Guest Speakers and Moderators. One of our champion farmers, Mrs. Ruth Njeri, represented the women farmers in a talk dubbed Women and Seeds.

G-BIACK was awarded First Prize for having the stand with the most diversity of seeds, excellent explanation on matters related to seed issues, and the best organized stand and teaching skills.
